#### Yule

As we enter the last month of the year, our thoughts turn to the winter holidays. Many religions celebrate different holidays in December, but the celebration of one holiday, Yule, isn't restricted to one specific religion, but is celebrated worldwide. Yule, the celebration of the winter solstice, is observed on Dec. 21, and marks the time of the year when the days begin to lengthen; and the long, dark nights begin to shorten, in other words, the return of the sun, the return of warmth and light.

This observance was extremely important to our agrarian ancestors. The return of the sun symbolized the promise of the return of spring, the ability to grow crops once again; as well as, the birthing of new herds of sheep, cows, and goats, in essence, the return to sustaining life.

Many joyful myths and stories revolve around this holiday. In Europe, Yule was originally celebrated by the Norse and Scandinavian peoples. In the Norse culture, "Jul" (Yule) refers to the god, Odin. Yule celebrations included bonfires, decorating with holly, mistletoe, and the boughs of evergreen trees, ritual sacrifices, feasts, and gift-giving.

The use of evergreen trees, wreaths, and garlands to symbolize eternal life was also a custom of the ancient Egyptians, Chinese, and Hebrews. It was also observed in Germany, with the placing of a Yule tree at an entrance or inside the house during the midwinter holidays.

Later, many other pagan customs also became associated with Christianity, including receiving gifts from Father Christmas/Santa, the 12 days of Christmas, and observing the stars to guide our way. Taurus and Orion are two of the more famous constellations visible at this time of the year in the Northern hemisphere.
